## **Incident Summary**

September 12, 2015 (Saturday @ 1:30PM)

Valley Fire erupts in Lake County

40,000 acres burned in 12 hours

1,238 Homes Destroyed

More than 19,300 residents were issued mandatory evacuation orders

18 shelters were open in Lake and Napa Counties

76,067 acres burned

4 Fatalities

September 12, 2015

FMAG request for Valley Fire submitted and approved

September 16, 2015

Repopulation begins

September 21, 2015


Governor requests a major disaster declaration for Calaveras and Lake Counties

September 22, 2015

President declares major disaster for Individual Assistance for Lake County.

- **September 24, 2015** President approves Public Assistance limited to Emergency Protective Measures Direct Federal Assistance (Category B)
- October 7, 2015
- Fire is 100% contained
- October 9, 2015 Lake and Calaveras Counties designated for Public Assistance (

- Be Ready to adapt/vary from the plan
